But what about Joseph? That was another matter, he planned to disappear out of Miriam's life but an angel came to him at night and told him not to be afraid to take Miriam as his wife as that which would be born of her was the direct work of God and that they should call the boy Jesus. Joseph was relieved and delighted and rushed to tell Miriam. Anna and Joachim packed the two of them off to Elizabeth and Zachariah saying "Zachariah will marry the two of you in the synagogue whilst you are there". And that is what happened on the first advent or coming of Christ.
